Ms. Gomillion updated the Board on the last PAC meeting from February 8, 2024. She said there were three presentations during that meeting. The first presentation was from Regina Thompson from Michigan Career Technical Institute. With programs that offer hands on work, paid experience, and work-based learning experience, and students just need to have an open vocational rehabilitation case open and a desire to learn, it is a program that helps students learn to advocate for themselves, their careers, or the career that they choose to go into. Students can also explore education and training after high school, Community College, and trade school certification programs. The second presentation was from STEM Up. Ms. Gomillion did not get that young lady's name, but she said it was a good presentation and it is a program about job readiness for people with disabilities. They offer training, coaching and internships in STEM fields. She said families should go through their schools to learn more about the programs. All school counselors should have this information and should be able to inform students and parents with students with disabilities. The last presentation Ms. Gomillion found the most interesting that she would use as resources. The Michigan Alliance for Families, Capri Martinis was the presenter, and it is a great resource for families with students that have disabilities when they need support or any kind of information. They partner you with a regional parent mentor and the regional parent mentor provides any information that you need, whatever questions you need to help your child be successful in education and after they graduate. They make sure they find the resources for you. They guide parents through the process to be a regional parent mentor. To be a regional parent mentor you must be employed with Michigan Alliance for Families and have a family member that has disabilities. The age range for these programs is from birth to 26 years old.

The Team reported on the Bid Pack #9- Beech Bus Loop. They went over the design recap, gave an overview of the project, they talked about the bid summary from the bid and the results that were received. Afterwards they would go into the bond team recommendation and answer any questions the Board would have after the presentation. A full recommendation packet would be submitted for Board approval at the next Board meeting on March 19, 2024. The total project budget/estimate is \$427,112. The project variance is (\$86,731) under budget.

The Team reported on the Old Schoolhouse Bid Pack #10. The presentation included some of the same information. They went over the design recap of the area, they reviewed the schedule, summary of the bids, recommendations, and answered questions from the Board. A full recommendation packet would be submitted for Board approval at the next Board meeting on March 19, 2024. The total project budget/estimate is \$784,141. The project variance is (\$663,545) under budget.

The Team reported on Secondary Campus Furniture Procurement. Jessica from French Associates was the lead person for new furniture. The presentation included a design recap and walk through, schedule update, and answers and questions. They had sample finishes available at the meeting for the Board members to see. They are 99% of the way there right now, still finalizing and will be reviewing the last proposal to make the final tweaks. Currently they are under budget. A full recommendation packet will be submitted for Board approval at the next Board meeting on March 19, 2024. The intent is to get the furniture order placed by April 1, 2024, and their target is to have the furniture delivered and ready by July 12, 2024.
