In February 2016, the Redford Union Schools, Superintendent and the Board of Education made a commitment to create a long-range improvement plan with emphasis on identifying how the district will measure accomplishments within one year. These year one and two goals are the foundation of our District Improvement Plan. The district completed a process that was data-driven, inclusive of district stakeholders and focused on the priorities that will help the district succeed.

As part of the planning process, the vision, mission and belief statements were reviewed and revised. Based on qualitative and quantitative data and a renewed vision, mission and beliefs, strategic goals and objectives were developed. Regular monitoring of progress and renewal is critical to the plan's success.

Stakeholders met to monitor the year-one and year-two goals during severing sessions, including District Technology Team, District Curriculum Review Team, Community Partnership, Administrator Leadership Team, Central Office staff, and Board of Education. These same team members met as a whole at a Strategic Plan Review retreat this spring. Goals were reviewed and year-three goals set.

Four community, parent/guardian and staff/student forums and an electronic survey resulted in 568 people providing input for the planning process. A Strategic Planning Team of 36 community members, parents/guardians, staff and students participated in an all-day planning retreat on April 9, 2016. A team of 24 participated in an implementation workshop on April 20, 2016. Throughout the planning process the community expressed high expectations of Redford Union Schools, becoming a world class school

district and having all students graduate from high school. Even though some of the goals are extremely high, they reflect the strong desire that has been expressed to embrace significant change and dramatically improve the school system. A final team, comprised of a very broad and diverse group of 36 internal stakeholders, developed the goals and year-one accomplishment

benchmarks. Stakeholders met to monitor the year-one goals during severing sessions, including District Technology Team, District Curriculum Review Team, Community Partnership, Administrator Leadership Team, Central Office staff, and Board of Education. These same team members, as well as parents, students, and other community members met as a whole at a Strategic Plan Review retreat this spring. Goals were reviewed and year-three goals set.

The final long-range plan, annual DIP and SIPs will be communicated to all stakeholders through new media, social media, print marketing materials, regular standing item on BOE agendas, district website, staff emails, staff meetings and professional development.
