Experts say that children of parents who are involved in their education have higher grades and fewer discipline problems. Your child needs—and wants—your guidance. And your involvement is the key to guiding your child toward school success. Make a commitment to:

- **Go to school** and meet his teachers and other staff members. Plan to keep in touch about your child's progress. Ask his teacher to notify you about any behavior issues she observes.
- **Monitor schoolwork.** Know how much homework your child has and if he has completed it.
- **Talk with your child** about being respectful to his teachers and classmates. He should also respect school property.



- **Attend parent-teacher conferences** and other school meetings and events.
 - **Support school policies.** Follow the dress code, avoid late arrivals and absences.
- Being involved is a way of letting your child know that you believe school is important.

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
